But if a man wanted to transform the dream of every small idea in to big idea, and then that becomes a successful project, he wanted to make strong after weakness, The simple idea I bought a football for three pounds then all Refugees collected and I told them that life is tough, but we must live with all the pain and rigors, and I told them that the Tiger stands strong, and eagle loves space and life of freedom. Also should be strong like tigers and live in space like eagles. We have a football field and we are brothers we play together and then eat together and then we go to the lesson in the Red Cross and then in the library for conversation and coffee. Hearts have gathered and are united before they gather our home lands and unite , our making of Barnsley City is unprecedented in the UK and today we dream of games with all refugees in London, Manchester and Liver pool , this is the idea of one man , now we are one hundred and fifty strong in the heart of one man.
